## Fall Leaf Tour, Estacada to Bend

Ten years ago I led the club on this tour through the mountains and over to Bend. Folks really seemed to like the route, especially some of the scenic stops along the way, so I decided to dust it off and run it again.

<u>DEPARTURE</u>: PGE Promontory Park, east of Estacada on Hwy 224. After departing Estacada, you will come to a large lake...near the end, turn right and head down to the marina. Please allow sufficient time to get here. Driver Meeting at 8:15; leave at 8:30 a.m.

**LUNCH**: BYO. We will stop at a park along the way.

The route takes us through a very pretty gorge along the Willamette River into the Breitenbush area where typically there are some nice fall colors. We then head east on Hwy 22 then south on Hwy 20/126 toward McKenzie Bridge with a stop at Sahalie Falls. After lunch, we drive along Cougar Reservoir including a photo op on top of the dam.

Proceeding on FS 19, we enjoy some very deserted roads (designated as a scenic byway) though a dense forest coming out at Oakridge and a stop at Salt Creek Falls. The last part of the drive takes us along the Cascades Highway past Davis, Elk, Lava and Sparks Lakes with fabulous views of the Three Sisters and Mt. Bachelor into Bend. Pretty easy drive totaling 265 miles.

**LODGING**: Doubletree (formerly the Phoenix). Room block was under club name, but may be expired. If full, check out Fairfield or any number of other options.

**HAPPY HOUR**: In the parking lot. BYOB and a snack to share.

**<u>DINNER</u>**: We will enjoy authentic Italian cuisine at Trattoria Sbandati. Great Food!

#### **SUNDAY: You have two options:**

- 1) For those who want to drool over Italian cars, you can visit the Oregon Festival of Cars, a premier car show featuring ITALIAN cars among others. We have been invited to join them for a short tour Sunday morning and then have brunch. Cost for the Sunday tour and brunch is \$75/couple, or \$50 for one. - 2) Join the rest of us and enjoy a leisurely drive along the Old McKenzie Pass Hwy stopping at the observation deck where you can see at least 11 of the Cascade Mountain peaks. We will stop in Springfield for lunch and then head home.




