## A MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT



#### **AROO NEEDS YOU!**

Whether you've been in the Alfa Romeo Owners of Oregon for one, ten, twenty, or forty years, your club needs your strong support... NOW! This is not just my usual plea for volunteers or participants at upcoming events, I'm talking about the on-going existence of this club. We are entering a critical transition as four Board members are not seeking re-election. If concerned members step up and fill those positions, we'll be fine. If not, this club will be in trouble. Six people can't do all the work. So here's what you have to do if you care about AROO.

First, give serious thought to running for the Board. If you are a long-term member and have never served on the Board, it's your turn. Even if you just joined us, we need all the skills, talent, and time you have to offer. This is no time to be standing around with your hands in your pockets, kicking the dirt, hoping someone else raises their hand. The Board runs the business of the club, sets the calendar, makes policy, crafts the budget, and otherwise makes things work. This is a volunteer organization and nothing gets done unless someone does it. And the Board is where most of that "doing" gets done. So, do it.

Second, vote in this year's election. We have right around 150 members and typically only 25 or 30 of you cast votes. The Board election is how members can influence the club's leadership and direction. Not voting says you don't care, and it's discouraging to work for and represent people who don't care. So cast your vote by mail or in person at the November meeting, but vote and show that you care about AROO. And tell your fellow club members to vote, too.

Third, once we have a new Board, lend a hand. Way too much is expected of Board members. While we are supposed to coordinate events, in past years we have become the only ones working on them. So give a Board member a break this year and volunteer to put on a tour, organize an event, or present a program at a meeting. They will need your help.

And here's more: our annual AROO Auction is at the November meeting, same night as the election. So in addition to bringing your ballot, bring some stuff to sell (Alfa related is nice, but not required) and some money to spend. The last couple of years we brought in enough to pay the rent on our meeting room for the whole year. Let's do it again.

That's about all I've got. We had a great President's Tour (see elsewhere for the story and photos) and we have the Volunteer Appreciation Dinner on October 18 and Track Day on the 24th. Here's a special deal: sign up to be a volunteer at Track Day and you can come to the Volunteer Dinner on the honor system. I'll be out there and I hope to see you there supporting your club and having a good time.


## TOM McGIRR'S FALL TOUR TO ASTORIA



## 750/101 Fuel tank Filter Cleaning

Perhaps your ol' sprint or spider isn't what it used to be . You've tuned it, electrified it, carbureted it, and it still doesn't go. Perhaps you've overlooked the always fun to clean tank fuel filter. What makes it fun is that it's INSIDE the tank. This past weekend, we pulled the filter out; you'll need a 17mm allen wrench and maybe a cheater to help free it if it's not been done in recent memory...or ever. The filter is a nice piece of work; brass mesh surrounding a metal frame; with an o-ring gasket set in top end thru which the fuel intake pipe passes. A vertical sheetmetal cylinder, about 1 inch larger diameter than the filter, and somewhat taller, is spot welded inside the tank; it's purpose is to prevent fuel sloshing from destroying the filter in those 1.5-G corners..or other Rally surprises. The bottom of this cylinder has two 1/8inch diameter holes, one front, one aft, which allow fuel access to the filter when fuel level drops below the top of the spot-welded cylinder.

We found the two holes plugged with sand and rust. Apparently someone tried to run the car on sand and water in the past, because the cylinder was half full of sand and rust. The filter brass mesh had several holes, which we repaired with J-B-Weld, after soaking the TOTALLY varnish-plugged filter in carburetor cleaner for 2 hours. Obviously the only fuel (and sand and rust) passing thru the filter was thru the holes in the filter. The fuel pump seems to have miraculously survived this punishment, as the little 1600 ripped right along during a subsequent test drive.

Well worth the effort!!







## Fifth Annual AROO President's Tour a Big Success by Roger Dilts

Nearly 40 members and friends of AROO gathered on the first Sunday morning of autumn in the Columbia Gorge, ready to head into the Gifford Pinchot National Forest on the fifth annual AROO President's Tour. Connie and I braved the drive out to the start with the top down. Dang, it was cold and our fingers got pretty stiff, but we arrived with smiles and coffee and cookies for all, so we got a warm welcome. There was a great mix of cars, including several spiders, a couple of Supers, a Sprint, a GTV and GT Jr, plus a Morgan, a Jaguar Mk II, and VW GTI. As soon as everyone got signed in, we lined up in two groups and headed north along the Wind River Highway. The fall colors were just coming out – bright yellow big leaf maples and crimson vine maples lined the road and filtered the morning light.

After a fairly straight run past the town of Carson, we began a stunning climb up through the forest on Oldman Pass. The road is recently paved so the surface is perfect and the turns as sweet and crisp as a fall apple. Once over the top, we took our first break at the McClennan Overlook and were treated to a rare cloudless view of Mt. St. Helens. A few miles further on, the quality of the road dropped considerably and few short unpaved sections and pavement slumps kept speeds slow and eyes out for potholes. Once through that, we took a nice long break at the Lower Falls Recreation Area on the Lewis River. A short walk through the mossy woods took us to an overlook with stunning views of the falls. After we'd had enough splendor, we piled back into the cars and continued the tour.


The road continued rather rough, although the more leisurely speeds encouraged sightseeing, at least by navigators. Drivers had to keep a sharp eye out. Here the cliffs are close in and verdant with moss and ferns and we catch quick glimpses of whitewater as the road crosses tumbling mountain streams. After another nasty patch of road, things improved quite nicely for a long, sweeping descent through the forest to the town of Trout Lake and down the beautiful White Salmon River valley to end the tour with lunch at Everybody's Brewing.

I started the AROO President's Tour five years ago as a way to share with my friends some of the roads I'd found doing rally recon. We've gone to some great places together and I've really enjoyed it. Thanks to all who've come along over the years. As my time as president ends, I hope I've started a tradition that will be continued by the next AROO president, whoever that may be.
