2016 ALFA WANNABE TOUR

Tom McGirr's 2016 Alfa Wannabe Tour

<u>Dates</u>: May 29-June 5. This trip takes us through the Grand Tetons and Yellowstone National Park. Essentially all the schools in the surrounding states are still in session <u>until</u> at least June 4th so it will be an *optimal* time to visit the two parks mid-week without large crowds and a better chance to see wildlife. I did Yellowstone many years ago at this time and it was really nice and quiet.

ITINERARY:

May 29: Departing from Salem OR, drive to Baker City-Stay in the Grand Geiser Hotel (very elegant and classy). Route will take us through the John Day Fossil Beds with lunch at a little spot in Mitchell. Great roads!

May 30: Head to Stanley Idaho, located at the base of the Sawtooth Mountains. The scenery here is breathtaking. Our lodging will be in some rustic cabins along the Salmon River overlooking the Mtns.

May 31: This drive will be through the Rocky Mountains and very scenic. We will arrive in the Grand Tetons early afternoon and take in the East side of the scenic loop in the park with many photo stops before arriving at our hotel. We are staying at Jackson Lake Lodge in the park.

June 1: The morning drive will first include the West side of the scenic loop including stops at many of the vista points including Jenny Lake. Then we take the short drive into Yellowstone stopping in West Thumb for lunch before viewing Artist and Inspiration Points in Yellowstone's version of the Grand Canyon. We will then continue to Monmouth Hot Springs taking both the upper and lower Monmouth geyser basins before checking into the historic Monmouth Hot Springs Hotel.

June 2: Another short drive down to Yellowstone Lake Hotel (another historic and VERY nice place!). We will be stopping at the Norris, Lower, Middle and Upper (Old Faithful Area) so plan on bringing your walking shoes and cameras!

June 3: After leaving Yellowstone, we drive through the rugged Bitterroot Mtns to Missoula. This is supposed to be a very scenic drive without a lot of traffic. We will visit Virginia City and Boot Hill on the way.

June 4: Today we head west to Walla Walla on some great open roads to enjoy some great wines, a gourmet dinner and a stay at the historic Marcus Whitman Hotel. Included will be some stops at historical sites in the Nez Perce Reservation.

June 5: You will have the option to get on I-5 and speed home or follow me for a little longer but very scenic drive through Goldendale, Trout Lake and down to the Columbia River near Hood River and home.

Need to RSVP by Wednesday by January 12, 2016. I have one opening now but will maintain an alternate list in case there are cancellations. Estimated lodging costs between \$1400-\$1500. Meal costs additional.

PAST AND PRESENT

AROO Cup Rally Series: 2015 Round Up and 2016 Kick Off by

Roger Dilts, Series Director

The 2015 AROO Cup Rally Series was a resounding success. Starting with 21 students attending the rally school to learn the basics, we had at least 14 teams in each of our Sunday half-day rallies. All began at the French Prairie Rest Area and wound their way through rural Clackamas County, exposing rallyists to challenging routes and instructions. The purpose of the rally series is to have fun while learning TSD rallying. To keep it a learning experience, rallyists see more traps in one morning than the Monte Shelton throws at them in two days. We always review the traps afterward so that everyone sees what was intended. Other than a couple of hiccups in route instructions, it was a pretty flawless year. This was the first year entrants could choose between two classes: Vintage (with no calculating devices or rally tables) and Standard (calculators allowed), with awards presented in Vintage only. As in the Monte Shelton, the overwhelming majority decided on Vintage, forgoing "all that math" and focusing on route following and "seat of the pants" speed holding. Results are in the accompanying tables. The top three teams were awarded complimentary entrance to the AROO Holiday party, where they received their trophies.

The 2016 season is right around the corner and promises to be just as exciting. We'll again kick off with the Rally School, on March 12 (time and location to be determined), and the first rally the next day. I'll be writing the March Rally (tentatively titled, "3 Stooges and a Monte"); past Monte Shelton Rally Master Simon Levear has May, and past AROO Cup Rally champs Bill and Sue Colisch are doing June. We'll see who signs up to write the April event. Below is the schedule, with all rallies starting at French Prairie Rest Area on SOUTHBOUND I-5, farthest back parking lot. Registration will start at 9, first car out at 10:01. Cost will be \$20 per car, \$15 if you've preregistered with me at arcvolcon@gmail.com:

ALFA ROMEO CAR CLUB 2016 SUMMER TOUR

August 25-29 (Thursday-Monday)
YOU NEED TO SIGN UP NOW IN ORDER TO SECURE A SPOT!

This will be a 5 day/4 night trip (think of it as a mini-vacation) to the Wallowa Mountains. The roads and scenery on this trip are really outstanding! If you have not been out here before, you owe it to yourself to see some of the finest offerings in Oregon and the country.

In order to make a trip like this possible, it is necessary to secure lodging *early* as once these places are full, there are <u>no</u> other options. Hence, I personally have reserved Wallowa Lake Lodge and will be required to pay ½ of the cost (\$3,200) in early January and the balance in late May. Any unreserved rooms will be released May 25th. It is unlikely you will be able to find lodging thereafter.

If you want to secure a space, you need to send me a deposit of \$250 asap. A subsequent billing for the balance of the Lodge cost will be sent out in late April.

<u>DETAILS</u>: The tour is going to depart from Government Camp on Mt. Hood on Thursday mid-morning with the destination being Baker City. We will drive towards Maupin, see White River Falls, enjoy the high desert via Bakeoven Rd as well as a spectacular section of Hwy 19 past Cathedral Rocks in the John Day Fossil Beds. Time permitting, we will take a short walk among the fossil beds as well take in the Sumner Dredge Park, an excellent exhibit telling the story of the mining in the area. Lodging will be the Always Welcome Inn (special rate of only \$76 + tax) and dinner will be at Barley Browns Tap House, a great place to enjoy a craft beer and unwind after a day's drive.

Friday, we head towards Wallowa Lake Lodge. We will follow sections of the original Oregon Trail (stopping to walk in the actual wagon ruts), take in Hells Canyon Overlook (Snake River) and drive the Wallowa Mountain Loop road before arriving at the Lodge in the early afternoon. The lodge is located on the lake and is a classic. I still remember the last time we were there, enjoying a glass of wine and appetizers on the deck watching the sun set over the lake.

We will be able to actually unpack our suitcases as we are staying here <u>two</u> nights! They have given us a special price of \$100/night for lodge rooms and the cabins will run between \$180-\$225.

After enjoying a late breakfast (those that have been on my previous tours know that anything past 7:30 is unusual), those that are so inclined can join us for the short drive to Joseph to explore the shops and galleries, many of which feature world class bronze works cast in Joseph. I may try to schedule a foundry tour as well.

After lunch, we will drive back to the lake area and take the tram to the top of Mt. Howard where you can enjoy a glass of beer or wine and gaze out at the mountain tops and valleys. If you take the short hike to the mountain top, the views become *spectacular!* You can even see the Sawtooth Mtns in Idaho. Thereafter, we return to the lodge for an extended happy hour and dinner.

After *another* late morning breakfast, we head over to Condon on some wide open roads through the open prairies. Once we get past LaGrande, I guarantee you will have a smile on your face as you cruse through the corners and through the vast grasslands. Once we arrive at the Condon Hotel, you will be greeted by our hosts with a complimentary glass of beer or wine. Racheal, one of the managers, will provide us with some fabulous appetizers in the Saloon and thereafter, a gourmet dinner in the formal dining room. Condon Hotel has 18 rooms, all quite nice and ranging from around \$150-\$275 list price (I do not know what our discounted rate will be yet). I have also made a room block at the Condon Motel down the street for any overflow. Their rooms will only be \$62 a night if you want to save a few bucks or the hotel is full.

Monday morning, you will have the option of following me on some more back-roads to Salem, including the very fun Hwy 293 out of Antelope to Hwy 97, the Old McKenzie Pass Hwy and a lunch stop. If you are short on time, you could conceivably follow us to Condon, then split for I-84 and be home Sunday evening. Or, you can stay Sunday night and drive directly home Monday morning. Condon to I-84 will put you in Portland in about 2.4 hours and Salem in 3.4 hours, plenty of time to make an appearance at work.

While officially an Alfa Romeo Car Club tour, past Club participation has been light. Hence, I have opened the tour to the Alfa Wannabe Car Club and friends. There is only room for 12 more couples although I will maintain an alternate list in case of cancellations.

Once I get your RSVP, I will send you the lodging contact and room block info from which you will make your own reservations in Baker City and Condon. Hope to hear from you soon. Questions? Preface *

The Alfa models identified in these films are not all 100% certain. Some are easy, some not. No snide remarks about my (Simon) taste in films please.. As a guide to the model identifications listed, note the following All 2.0 Liter Spiders from the mid-70's on are called "Spider Veloce", unless I can specifically, and with certainty, label them as Graduates, or Quadrifoglios. The steel wheels are a dead giveaway on Graduates. All Italian cop cars from the 60's are labeled "Giulia Polizia", unless the paint scheme says, "Carabineri". They may actually have been Giulia Supers, TI's, or TI Supers. The same applies for the much later Giulietta 1.6 cars. I make no distinction between Normale and Veloce on the early Giuliettas. The Series 101 1600 Spiders are called "Spider I600". This is not the I05 series boat-tail Spider, which I refer to as "Duetto". I make no distinction between 1600 and 1750 Duettos. Some of the real oddball ones are either not listed, or were identified from various books. Enjoy the list, it does have some surprises in it.


