ABOUT AROO

In the late 1950s, two Giulietta Spider Veloces came to Portland. They were featured on a local TV show to promote a sports car race, participating in a race which they dominated, winning converts in the growing sports car scene. As interest and knowledge of Alfas grew, Alfa fans – known as "Alfisti" – began to gather at Rambo Motors, the new Alfa dealer in Portland, which trained mechanics and supported a racing team. In the early 1960s, Bob Rinde, Rambo's sales manager, joined the national Alfa Romeo Owners Club and others followed. By October 1968 there was enough local interest for Bob McGill to apply to start a chapter, making AROO the sixth AROC-US chapter.

New and Continuing Business:


10. Alfa Club Trailer:

ENJOYING YOUR ALFA



Enjoying Your Alfa

The delightful car you now drive has a fault. It irritates people who like to think the best must be difficult to live with. The idea of this booklet—come to think of it, the idea of your Alfa Romeo—is to make people who feel that way miserable.

Your Alfa is definitely one of the best and enjoying it is the easiest thing in the world. What's more, enjoying an Alfa goes on all the time. It isn't given to flightiness in the rain. It doesn't try to be cranky in the morning. And it won't turn temperamental at night.

Your Alfa will not make you the world's greatest driver. No car can. But it will convince you that some intelligent people have gone to a great deal of trouble to make a portion of your life as enjoyable and effortless as possible.

We have nothing to tell you that you won't find out yourself. There are no mysteries about an Alfa. But, as a collection of hints, perhaps these pages will help you find some Alfa pleasures a little sooner.

To begin with, you start...

Take starting, for instance. It's a plain and obvious sort of thing. But a suggestion: when the weather turns cool you will show a commendable respect for fine machinery if you push the clutch pedal to the floor while holding the key on. It takes quite a load off the engine.

All Alfas have an "easy-starting device." That's a graphic but long-winded name for something that does the job of a choke. Don't make use of it a habit. It isn't that it will wear out. But it pours a lot of raw gasoline into the engine, much of which can't be used. It's a grand thing on a cold day and means instant starts. But pulling it out (or pulling it up, depending on what Alfa you own) isn't necessary in warm weather. Even in cold weather, push the easy-starting device in (or down) as soon as possible after starting for the same reason. Too much gasoline going nowhere.

If you have a Veloce, in cold weather caress it a little by pressing the accelerator part way to the floor while your left hand turns the key all the way over.

With any car, don't let the starter grind the engine over time after time after time. If by any chance it doesn't catch the third or fourth time, turn the key all the way off. Wait a few seconds. Then try again.

Let the car warm up a bit before moving off even in the summer. In really cold weather, remember that "warming up the engine," while fine, doesn't do a thing for the thick, cold grease in the gearbox or differential. A couple of slow miles would be kind.

Most drivers abuse most cars in cold weather. The abuse comes from lack of lubrication while the oil is cold and slow-moving. The abuse doesn't come to the attention of most owners' checkbooks until the following spring or summer. It's quite easy not to drive straight away from the curb. Try it and feel smug.

2016 SUMMER TOUR

August 25-29 (Thursday-Monday) YOU NEED TO SIGN UP NOW IN ORDER TO SECURE A SPOT!

This will be a 5 day/4 night trip (think of it as a mini-vacation) to the Wallowa Mountains. The roads and scenery on this trip are really outstanding! If you have not been out here before, you owe it to yourself to see some of the finest offerings in Oregon and the country.

In order to make a trip like this possible, it is necessary to secure lodging *early* as once these places are full, there are <u>no</u> other options. Hence, I personally have reserved Wallowa Lake Lodge and will be required to pay ½ of the cost (\$3,200) in early January and the balance in late May. Any unreserved rooms will be released May 25th. It is unlikely you will be able to find lodging thereafter.

If you want to secure a space, you need to send me a deposit of \$250 asap. A subsequent billing for the balance of the Lodge cost will be sent out in late April.

DETAILS: The tour is going to depart from Government Camp on Mt. Hood on Thursday mid-morning with the destination being Baker City. We will drive towards Maupin, see White River Falls, enjoy the high desert via Bakeoven Rd as well as a spectacular section of Hwy 19 past Cathedral Rocks in the John Day Fossil Beds. Time permitting, we will take a short walk among the fossil beds as well take in the Sumner Dredge Park, an excellent exhibit telling the story of the mining in the area. Lodging will be the Always Welcome Inn (special rate of only \$76 + tax) and dinner will be at Barley Browns Tap House, a great place to enjoy a craft beer and unwind after a day's drive.

Friday, we head towards Wallowa Lake Lodge. We will follow sections of the original Oregon Trail (stopping to walk in the actual wagon ruts), take in Hells Canyon Overlook (Snake River) and drive the Wallowa

Mountain Loop road before arriving at the Lodge in the early afternoon. The lodge is located on the lake and is a classic. I still remember the last time we were there, enjoying a glass of wine and appetizers on the deck watching the sun set over the lake.

We will be able to actually unpack our suitcases as we are staying here two nights! They have given us a special price of \$100/night for lodge rooms and the cabins will run between \$180-\$225.

After enjoying a late breakfast (those that have been on my previous tours know that anything past 7:30 is unusual), those that are so inclined can join us for the short drive to Joseph to explore the shops and galleries, many of which feature world class bronze works cast in Joseph. I may try to schedule a foundry tour as well.

After lunch, we will drive back to the lake area and take the tram to the top of Mt. Howard where you can enjoy a glass of beer or wine and gaze out at the mountain tops and valleys. If you take the short hike to the mountain top, the views become *spectacular!* You can even see the Sawtooth Mtns in Idaho. Thereafter, we return to the lodge for an extended happy hour and dinner.

After *another* late morning breakfast, we head over to Condon on some wide open roads through the open prairies. Once we get past LaGrande, I guarantee you will have a smile on your face as you cruse through the corners and through the vast grasslands. Once we arrive at the Condon Hotel, you will be greeted by our hosts with a complimentary glass of beer or wine. Racheal, one of the managers, will provide us with some fabulous appetizers in the Saloon and thereafter, a gourmet dinner in the formal dining room. Condon Hotel has 18 rooms, all quite nice and ranging from around \$150-\$275 list price (I do not know what our discounted rate will be yet). I have also made a room block at the Condon Motel down the street for any overflow. Their rooms will only be \$62 a night if you want to save a few bucks or the hotel is full.

Monday morning, you will have the option of following me on some more back-roads to Salem, including the very fun Hwy 293 out of Antelope to Hwy 97, the Old McKenzie Pass Hwy and a lunch stop. If you are short on time, you could conceivably follow us to Condon, then split for I-84 and be home Sunday evening. Or, you can stay Sunday night and drive directly home Monday morning. Condon to I-84 will put you in Portland in about 2.4 hours and Salem in 3.4 hours, plenty of time to make an appearance at work.

While officially an Alfa Romeo Car Club tour, past Club participation has been light. Hence, I have opened the tour to the Alfa Wannabe Car Club and friends. There is only room for 12 more couples although I will maintain an alternate list in case of cancellations.






July Picnic Tour





Restoration Carts: Part 2 Advanced Restoration Carts and Attachments

Over the last few years working on restoring Alfas with my Dad, I have had to build and modify many of our restoration carts. I have discovered that putting a little bit more time into planing their usability and engineering can have a big impact on how smoothly restorations can go, over the life time of the cart. See example **Image #1**

Shown in Image one is an adjustable mounting plate for a suspension point cart. The plate is mounted first to the car after it has been jacked up onto jack stands when the car is first being put on the cart. The cart is first affixed in the rear trailing arm mounts then set down slowly and carefully on the front were the two center bolts are just dropped in and tightened up with nuts and lock washers. Two main advantages to this type of design are, it can fit a couple of different body lengths/discrepancies and you don't have to try to drill or egg-out a hole through two heavy steal plates while dangling over the front fender or nose. (note: it looks like the sand blasters swapped six of our fasteners for two of theirs with spaces to get under the plate.)

Another thing you may have noticed in our cart photos is that the long side pipes on our carts open to the front and rear of the car. This is actually not coincidence or just a byproduct of how we chose to cut the tubing, it is so that we can mount attachments with nesting tubes to aid in work on the tail or rear of the car. See **Image #2 & #3**.

Attachments such as these allow us to extend the frame. Which can be useful if for example we need to stabilize part of the front or rear, isolate the position of a particular part of the car in space or apply serious hydraulic leverage. See **Image #4.** Restoration carts are very useful tools by themselves, but with a little planing can be instrumental in facilitating how possible a restoration even is.


