ABOUT AROO

In the late 1950s, two Giulietta Spider Veloce's came to Portland. They were featured on a local TV show to promote a sports car race, participating in a race which they dominated, winning converts in the growing sports car scene. As interest and knowledge of Alfas grew, Alfa fans – known as "Alfisti" – began to gather at Rambo Motors, the new Alfa dealer in Portland, which trained mechanics and supported a racing team. In the early 1960s, Bob Rinde, Rambo's sales manager, joined the national Alfa Romeo Owners Club and others followed. By October 1968 there was enough local interest for Bob McGill to apply to start a chapter, making AROO the sixth AROC-US chapter.

BOARD MEMBER'S PAGE

From the Drivers seat 750/101 Girling Master Cylinder Lessons by Dave Beach, AROO/AROC

This months Drivers Seat is actually a great tech article submitted by Dave Beach. Enjoy.



This photo is of an original Girling Master cylinder (3/4" bore in this case). **The critical lesson here is adjustment of your brake pedal clearance**, accomplished by threading/unthreading the saddle bracket, (shown in upper right of photo to right of rubber bellows), such that the piston, (shiny "cylinder" shown in middle of lower part of photo), is allowed to fully seat in the bore of the master cylinder. When assembled, the spring forces the piston to seat into the bottom (furthest to right of photo) of the Master Cylinder bore, provided *you* have allowed clearance for its full "seating".

This is a close-up of the previous photo, showing the ever-critical small piston holes (there are 2, one shown, one on opposite side of the piston) which must be "just exposed" to incoming fluid, from the cylinder reservoir, in order to properly "re-fill" the brake hydraulic system whenever the brake pedal is fully released. Without these tiny holes exposed to input from reservoir, you cannot bleed the brake system..in simplest terms, you cannot fill the brake system with fluid...you <u>won't</u> "have brakes"!!

Operationally, whenever you apply the brake pedal, the piston is forced forward/out of its cylinder bore, moving the small holes past the lip of the seal shown above, creating a closed "compression chamber", just like when the intake valves close on your engine to beginning the compression stroke.. As the piston moves further into the "compression chamber" end of the cylinder, it's "increasing presence" builds pressure in the system (exactly like the engines pistons build compression as they rise in their cylinder).

Consequently, the brake fluid under compression moves out (via brake lines) into your wheel cylinders/calipers, moving shoes/pads onto drums/rotors.

PS: the piston is shaped like a solid rod, except for it's left end bored out as shown to permit fluid to enter the "compression chamber" via the 2 small holes.

PPS: the seal shown bears the brunt of the compressive force applied as you stand on your brake pedal. On the Girling, the shaped plastic sleeve helps to keep the seal lip properly seated.

PPPS: there is a second seal, at opposite end of the piston, which only serves to retain fluid coming into piston/cylinder by gravity from the reservoir...it is not under significant pressure by any means.

PPPPS: on top photo, the red plug is the cylinder inlet from reservoir, the black plug is the outlet line to brake system.

ENJOYING YOUR ALFA



... then you drive

You're started. How about driving? Just one thing, really: Relax. An expert would say . . .

Don't hang onto the wheel, hold onto the wheel.

There's quite a difference. You'll be surprised the first time you remember this and find yourself hanging, then relax to holding the wheel. Fingers guiding, not gripping is the idea. Your Alfa wants to track straight down the road. Don't try to correct for every little bump; let the Alfa do it while you sit there appreciating the sure-footed suspension.

And sit back in that seat. It's very tiring for passengers and people in other cars to see drivers sitting hunched over the wheel or straight up like a pole and that fine bucket seat not getting a chance to hold you as it was designed to do.

Now that engine. You may know a lot about it already. It's all aluminum. (Alfa engines have been for years.) Or you may neither know nor care much about it. Fine. You don't have to. The only thing we'd suggest is that you remember that it likes to work. It doesn't like to struggle. That's known as "lugging." But it likes to work.

Engines work by turning. That's what the tachometer (revolution counter) tells you: how fast the engine is turning (revolutions per minutes).






I am hoping to be able to have dinner at Heidi's Italian Restaurant. Really good food and the chef/owner studied in Italy to hone her culinary skills.




