ABOUT AROO

In the late 1950s, two Giulietta Spider Veloce's came to Portland. They were featured on a local TV show to promote a sports car race

which they dominated, winning converts in the growing sports car scene. As interest and knowledge of Alfas grew, Alfa fans — known as "Alfisti" — began to gather at Rambo Motors, the new Alfa dealer in Portland, which trained mechanics and supported a racing team. In the early 1960s, Bob Rinde, Rambo's sales manager, joined the national Alfa Romeo Owners Club and others followed. By October 1968 there was enough local interest for Bob McGill to apply to start a chapter, making AROO the sixth AROC-US chapter.

This motel is now owned by Moonstone, the same folks who oversee the Oregon Gardens in Silverton. Dinner will be on your own at the Green around 7 pm.




I was able to negotiate a GREAT rate of \$129 for their DELUXE rooms which have a fireplace and a very nice patio facing out to the gardens.

The next day we will enjoy a leisurely 3 ½ hour drive taking in another 7 covered bridges and finish the tour with a late lunch at a brewpub in Independence.





OLD SPIDER TOUR 2017



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





The twin-camshaft engine with 80° inclined overhead valves is the best design known for high power and fuel efficiency. The twin-cam power units in the Sport Sedan and Sprint Veloce enjoy all the benefits of that half-century of unmatched experience. Each has a cylinder head, block, and oil pan, of light, rigid aluminum, an attribute that American auto engines may have in the future. Durability is enhanced by the duplex roller chain camshaft drive, sodium-cooled exhaust valves, a fully counterbalanced forged crankshaft, individual cylinder liners, and the finned oil pan with built-in oil cooling labyrinth. And fuel is metered by Alfa Romeo's own mechanical injection system, which automatically fulfills the requirements of emissions, economy and performance.

The Alfa Romeo braking system is unsurpassed in its class. It uses stable, caliper-type disc brakes at all four wheels.
