ABOUT AROO

In the late 1950s, two Giulietta Spider Veloce's came to Portland. They were featured on a local TV show to promote a sports car race

which they dominated, winning converts in the growing sports car scene. As interest and knowledge of Alfas grew, Alfa fans — known as "Alfisti" — began to gather at Rambo Motors, the new Alfa dealer in Portland, which trained mechanics and supported a racing team. In the early 1960s, Bob Rinde, Rambo's sales manager, joined the national Alfa Romeo Owners Club and others followed. By October 1968 there was enough local interest for Bob McGill to apply to start a chapter, making AROO the sixth AROC-US chapter.

Getting there:

For those who desire, AROO will be meeting for an informal group departure from Vancouver, WA for the drive up to Bellevue. This is not an intended to be an organized tour. The group will be leaving from the Starbucks located in Crossroads Center at 14300 NE 20th Ave, Vancouver, WA 98686. Departure from this Starbucks will be at 8:15 am prompt. If you're running late, don't worry, you have the address of where you need to be by 11 am.

- From I-5 North take NE 139th Street (Exit 7B), turn right onto NE 139th, then turn left onto NE 20th Ave ramp, then turn left into Crossroads Center shopping center, Starbucks is located at the south end of the shopping center to the left.
- From I-205 North take NE 134th Street/NE 23rd Ave (Exit 36), then continue straight onto NE 23rd Ave, then turn left at NE 139th Street, then turn right at NE 20th Ave, then turn left into Crossroads Center shopping center, Starbucks is located at the south end of the shopping center to the left.

Our destination will be at the intersection of 116th Avenue NE at NE 22nd Place in Bellevue, WA. Fred has placed signage at this intersection to direct you. The distance for this leg is 162 miles, taking about 2-1/2 hours.

Below is a quick intro of Jon and Greg and their collections.

Jon Shirley, served as president of Microsoft Corporation from 1983 until 1990, then served on the Board of Directors until 2008. As time allowed, he followed his passion for race and uniquely historic cars the same way he ran Microsoft, with a living plan and the attention to detail. Jon got hooked on car shows in the early 90s after he and his wife spent three days polishing and preparing their newly acquired '67 Ferrari 275 GTS/4 NART Spyder for Pebble Beach. This was Ferraris first year at Pebble Beach. Jon then expanded his enthusiasm for vintage racing and touring which is the primary focus now. The collection represents the mix of show winners, vintage racers, and Grand Tourers with Ferrari, Delahaye, Jaguar, MG, Mercedes-Benz, Ford, Austin Healey, Porsche, Shelby, Lotus, and Alfa Romeo, mostly classic or vintage with a few newer cars, but all with a significant place in automotive history. Jon now spends much of his time touring, and visiting car & art shows, museums, and private collections.

Greg Whitten didn't start Microsoft, but when he hired on in 1979 there were just over 10 employees. He guided development of MS Basic, OS/2, Office, and Windows architecture until retiring in 1998. Now he helps to run Numerix, a leading provider of risk analytics software, and enjoys his family and a passion for technology and cars. His collection is dominated by Ferraris but includes Aston Martin, Lancia, Jaguar, ERA, Hispano-Suiza, and Morgan. Greg's passion for the cars is primarily driving them on track or around the area and features many of the newer, technologically advanced cars. The ERA R2B "Romulus" was an advanced powerful race car in 1935 with a straight 6 cyl, twin camshafts, a supercharger, and pre-selector gearbox. His two Ferrari LaFerraris with their hybrid power, integrated dual clutch system with the electric motors, complex cooling systems, and active suspension and aerodynamic controls demonstrates today's advancements in vehicle design. Rarely seen at the world's car shows, he is often found at the vintage race events like the Rolex Monterey Motorsports Reunion or other tracks where he can enjoy and exercise his cars the way they were meant to be used.

ALFA ROMEO SPRINT VELOCE CLOTHING ADVANCED ENGINEERING WITH DARING STYLE

The power train and chassis of the Sprint Veloce are much the same as those of the Sport Sedan. The Sprint Veloce is shorter, with a wheelbase of 94.5 inches instead of the Sport Sedan's 98.8 inches. Otherwise they are similar under the skin. You might well ask why, then, would anyone prefer the two-door coupe to the more practical four-door sedan? The answer comes readily enough. The Sprint Veloce is a different life-style, a different state of mind.

The Sprint Veloce's boldly original personality took shape on the sketchpad of Giorgetto Giugiaro of Turin, one of the

world's most respected car designers, and was refined in Alfa Romeo's own styling center. There this new model was given a more tailored look, with special moldings added along with flared wheel openings and the rocker panels. A new rear-view mirror design was also adopted.
