




ABOUT AROO

In the late 1950s, two Giulietta Spider Veloce's came to Portland. They were featured on a local TV show to promote a sports car race

which they dominated, winning converts in the growing sports car scene. As interest and knowledge of Alfas grew, Alfa fans — known as "Alfisti" — began to gather at Rambo Motors, the new Alfa dealer in Portland, which trained mechanics and supported a racing team. In the early 1960s, Bob Rinde, Rambo's sales manager, joined the national Alfa Romeo Owners Club and others followed. By October 1968 there was enough local interest for Bob McGill to apply to start a chapter, making AROO the sixth AROC-US chapter.



Alfa Romeo TCR confirmed



ALFA ROMEO GIULIETTA
TCR CONFIRMED FOR ROY
BLOCK, TIM LEWIS JR.;
COMPASS RACING
INVOLVED...

Alfa Romeo looks set to be represented in IMSA Michelin Pilot Challenge competition, with a new two-car TCR effort planned for next year.


Both cars took part in this week's Michelin On-Track Opportunity at Daytona International Speedway ahead of next month's four-hour Pilot Challenge season-opener on the Florida high banks. Florida-based KMW Motorsports with TMR Engineering will continue the relationship they began last year with Compass Racing, with the cars being based out of its Boca Raton facility.

"Louis [Milone] and I really enjoyed working together over the past season running two of our Audi RS 3 LMS TCR cars, and we're excited to launch the Alfa Romeo Giulietta TCR officially in the coming weeks," said Compass Racing team principal Karl Thomson.

Longtime Pilot Challenge driver Roy Block and Tim Lewis Jr. have been confirmed in one of the entries under the KMW/TMR banner, with the lineup in the second Alfa Romeo Giulietta TCR still to-be-determined by Compass.

"We're excited to have Roy back for another season," said TMR owner and lead engineer Louis Milone. "He and Tim have been testing a bunch over the past month or so and have a really great relationship. We're expecting them to do really well."



The two cars combined to complete more than 300 miles over the single-day of running, with on-site support from constructor Romeo Ferraris, which Thomson said showcased the strength and reliability of the Italian brand.

Although not yet listed as an official IMSA partner, Alfa Romeo is set to become the fifth different TCR manufacturer set to take part in Pilot Challenge next year, joining Audi, Volkswagen, Honda and Hyundai in the ever-expanding class.

More than a dozen full-season entries are expected, doubling the number of cars that contested the series in 2018.

Along the way, there is a rally going on with checkpoints and scores, and dash plaques and intrigue. It is the Northwest Classic Rally, and this year it is August 2-4th, in Olympia, WA.

AROO RALLY CUP event #1 is in the books!

We had 20 people sign up for the rally, many had attended the Rally School the day before.

This was a glorious, sunny day and a chance to shake out the rally cobwebs both from the vintage car and from participant's brains. Based on Roger Dilts' 2018 March Rally, the theme was TOWARDS and ONTO and kept looping the rallyists around St Paul and Champoeg. Many people missed the very first "TOWARDS DONALD" and failed to turn left at the blinker off Broadacres Rd. on to Butteville Rd. Red off-course markers and a call back mileage, did not seem to get people back onto the course, and several missed the first 2 checkpoints.

After Regularity #3, the first instruction for Leg #4 was: L TOWARD GERVAIS This meant to take the FIRST opportunity to go LEFT and be "TOWARDS" Gervais (a town) from that point until the next Numbered Route Instruction took you STRAIGHT, RIGHT or LEFT (which happened at the Bear Right @ Y on Mt Angel -Gervais Rd). Almost all contestants passed the Left, and went left at a "T" and then hit another "T" where the TOWARDS GERVAIS put them back onto the rally route, but a full 1.4 miles off. So the mileage at the Bear Right @ Y did not match up. Several proceeded past the turn and got irreparably lost.

The next Rally is Sunday April 14th with Roger Dilts as rallymaster offering you another great chance to practice your rally skills. Signing up for either or both is pretty easy, just send an email to the Rally Chairs: paul.eklund@alfaclub.org or yulia.smolyansky@alfaclub.org and then show up!





Dave Alfonso:

Mr. Smooth! No one could relax in a race car at speed like he could.

He's still considered the greatest F1 driver of all time because during his career, he won a world championship in every marque that was racing at the time. It's never been duplicated. He was so cool on the track that he would actually coach rookie drivers on where to enter and exit turns during a race and then go on to win.

I met him in 1985 when Alfa Romeo was the featured marque at the Historic Races at Laguna Seca. They flew his World Championship car from the Alfa Romeo Museum in Milan, Italy, to Monterey for him to drive for the crowd. They went Crazy! I took this photo of him in that car. He was 74 years old then.

Denny Torgeson:

I too was at Laguna Seca in 1985 for Alfa. I was standing behind a rope barrier in the pits along with many other fans when Fangio got out of his Alfa after a noon time demo run by famous drivers (Phil Hill was another driver) and came straight towards me to greet the fans waiting for him. He walked directly up to me. I did not have anything for him to sign and did not know what to do so I just stuck my hand out to shake and he too put his hand out and shook my hand! I was stunned, what an honor. He was a very gracious person. I have a picture of him in this Alfa in the Corkscrew turn. What an experience!
