In the late 1950s, two Giulietta Spider Veloce's came to Portland. They were featured on a local TV show to promote a sports car race

which they dominated, winning converts in the growing sports car scene. As interest and knowledge of Alfas grew, Alfa fans — known as "Alfisti" — began to gather at Rambo Motors, the new Alfa dealer in Portland, which trained mechanics and supported a racing team. In the early 1960s, Bob Rinde, Rambo's sales manager, joined the national Alfa Romeo Owners Club and others followed. By October 1968 there was enough local interest for Bob McGill to apply to start a chapter, making AROO the sixth AROC-US chapter.

The New Alfa Romeo Tonale Concept Vehicle: Electrification Meets Beauty and Dynamism

March 5, 2019, Turin, Italy - Alfa Romeo is breaking into the electric vehicle world at the 2019 Geneva International Motor Show, revealing the new concept of the Alfa Romeo Tonale premium compact SUV. The Tonale is the first plug-in hybrid and the first premium compact SUV for Alfa Romeo. It rewrites the rules of today's fastest growing segment using the brand's trademark language made up of gorgeous Italian design and unparalleled driving dynamics.

A Premium Compact SUV Inspired by Beauty and the Alfa Romeo Brand's Design DNA

The design of the Tonale is an expression that looks fondly into our future. Its compact dimensions embody Italian design and the unmistakable, original and modern style typical of Alfa Romeo—striking the perfect blend of valued

heritage and anticipation of a new evolution. Alfa Romeo holds dear the essence of Italian art and sculpture through the timeless "artigianale" experience of hand sculpting.

The Tonale is inspired by the beauty and nuances associated with human forms. The pure lines and volumes result in the organic movement of light. Its design tangibly recalls a number of time-honored style elements that are synonymous with the rich history of Alfa Romeo, with an execution that excites a modern approach to the new Alfa Romeo anatomy.

The Alfa Romeo plug-in hybrid premium compact SUV makes its debut at the 2019 Geneva International Motor Show

An element that echoes the tradition of the Alfa Romeo Brand's DNA is the phone dial wheel. The 21-inch wheel design displays this through a lightweight architectural construction, creating an honest and impactful execution of the circular theme. The lineage of the phone dial wheel dates back to the 1960s, worn proudly on the iconic 33 Stradale. The distinctive Tonale wheel design is also celebrated with an exclusive Pirelli® tire scheme.

The bold, elegant volumes of the bodyside make reference to a seemingly distant past, recalling the sensual qualities found in the pure forms of the Duetto and the Disco Volante Spider, while the Linea GT interprets the tension and confidence of

the pouncing stance found on the beloved GT Junior. The front end sports the Alfa Romeo Brand's signature Trilobo and the distinctive Scudetto grille that serves as the central point of strength, driving the speed and fluidity that moves throughout the Tonale. Portland Vintage Racing Festival



The SVRA has been running the traditional Portland vintage race for three years now, and they have brought new life to this event. They have added infield attractions, special guests, and more excitement and been rewarded with a 150+ car field last year. The SVRA does things a bit different from SOVREN, but not in a major way, and if your car is eligible to run with SOVREN, it will be accepted to run at the SVRA Portland race.

One of SVRA President and CEO Tony Parella's stated goals is to add enough events and attract enough sponsors to be able to keep entry fees at a minimum, even reduce them. He has gone a long way to achieving that goal when you realize that SVRA's entry fees for 2109 are the same as they were in 2012 when the organization "went national."







2020 Wannabe Tour Canada

2020 Alfa Wannabe Tour Canada

Hello Alfa Wannabe's,

2020 tour will be going to Canada. There was a large preference for this tour over the suggested trip to the SW National parks due in part to the two days + each way to get to the parks.

I have secured a room block for the Fairmont Chateau Lake Louise for two nights, which was the key to moving forward. While I had hoped to stay one night at Moraine Lake Lodge, they do not take large group reservations. However, there are shuttles that take folks to and from Lake Louise and Lake Moraine so we will still be able to take a day trip to visit this special place. Staying two days at the hotel will give us ample time to explore the area trails and partake in other activities available around the area without fighting all the parking problems in the area.



I have also backed up the date of the trip to June 21-June 28. I learned that often the snow remains at Lake Louise until the first week of June, which would have greatly limited access to the trails in the area. I was unable to secure rooms for the 3rd week so the 4th week of June it is! While this will mean a few more visitors to compete with, the good thing is there is a much better chance the waters of Lake Louise will be that beautiful aqua color.

Below is a revised itinerary for the trip which is

somewhat different from originally outlined and *eliminates* duplications from the 2017 Canada trip except for a night in Spokane.

Day 1-Back roads to Spokane-Lodging at the Historic Davenport Hotel.



Day 2-Fairmount Hot Springs Resort. We arrive early afternoon to enjoy the springs.

Day 3- Rim Rock Lodge in Banff. The drive will include views of Kootenay Valley, the Paint Pots, a short hike to see Marble Canyon, Vermillion Pass (Continental Divide) and Vermillion Lakes. We will take the Banff Gondola to the top of Sulfur Mountain for lunch while enjoying stunning views of Banff and the surrounding mountains. After lunch, we will soak in Banff Upper Hot Springs then check in to our hotel.

Day 4: On the way to Chateau Lake Louise, our route will include a scenic drive around Banff including Sunrise Corner, Tunnel Mountain, Hoodoos Viewpoint,

Minnewanka Loop, a drive to the top of Mt. Norway and a hike into breathtaking Johnson Canyon. We arrive at Lake Louise early enough to explore some to the scenic trails around the lake in the afternoon.

Day 5: Our plan is to catch the shuttle to Moraine Lake for at least part of the day. From there, a variety of short to moderate hikes are available. We will either enjoy a box lunch on the trail or possibly have lunch at Moraine Lake Lodge. There are canoes available to rent on both Lake Moraine and Lake

Louise from which the views at opposites ends of the lakes are amazing.

Day 6: We drive the Ice Highway to the Fairmount Jasper Lodge located in Jasper. While not a long distance, we will take most of the day to explore the following: Peyto Lake, Columbia Ice Field, Sunwapta, Athabasca and Tangle Falls, Crowfoot Glacier, Saskistchewan Lookout, Herbert Lake and Mistaya Canyon.

Day 7: We will drive to Miette Hot Springs for a soak, then drive to Kamloops where we will stay Sun Peaks Resort located at the ski resort in the mountains.

Day 8: Off to Harrison Hot Springs Resort.


Day 9: Home bound. I have 18 couples who have expressed interest in the Canada trip. *Please reconfirm*. If you voiced a desire to go to the National Parks only, but want to join this tour, let me know. Finally, if you have been sitting on the fence but would like to sign up, please let me know now! It will be diffi

I will need to pay a deposit of \$2,700 when I send in the Fairmount lodging contracts to secure the Lake Louise rooms by May 31. An additional deposit of \$13,891 is due September 1. Hence, please reconfirm (or indicate) your interest by Thursday May 30 and send me a deposit of \$1,000 to my attention c/o 3420 Dogwood Dr S, Salem OR 97302. I do not want to reserve too many rooms (I can cancel up to two rooms w/o penalty). Be advised it will be near impossible to add more rooms down the road. I will start working on the balance of the lodging upon my return from Africa in late June. I will let you know what additional deposit I will need thereafter.

I regret having to ask for deposits so far in advance but the hotels are in position to require partial payments due to the demand. While we could try to stay outside of Lake Louise, the horror stories I have read about in terms of traffic and non-existent parking has convinced me this is the way to go. The Fairmont gave us a very good deal (discount of around 23%) at both Lake Louise and Jasper.

Two AROO, Tom McGirr Tours

AROO SUMMER TOUR

July 12 -14

Tour departs from Salem Waterfront Park at 8:30 sharp. Meet in the parking lot next to the Carousal which is located on the West side of Front Street opposite State Street. Coming from the north, follow Salem Parkway then right onto Front Street at the stoplight, then right into the SECOND Waterfront Park entrance. From the South, turn left from Commercial Street onto Ferry Street then immediately left into the park. First gas stop is in 168 miles so plan accordingly. BRING YOUR OWN LUNCH.

If you arrive late, the first pit stop is at Timber Linn Park in Albany (Exit 233, L heading east under I-5 and L into park) and second stop is at Elijah Bristow State Park on Hwy 58 about 9 miles east of I-5).

We head over the Willamette Pass to Odell Lake for a lunch stop. After leaving Beaver Marsh on 97, the fast and fun part kicks in! I suspect I have incorporated new roads to most including Silver Lake Rd (not to be confused with Hwy 31) on the way to the Lakeview Best Western.

Before checking in, we will visit Stringers Orchard Winery and Distillery located in New Pine Creek, just past the Oregon border. They have operated a winery since 1984 based on the Oregon Wild Plum, a very distinct fruit from the plum we see the grocery store.

The Wild Plum is one of nature's most unique fruits. It grows at the borders of Oregon, California and Nevada in the high desert at between 4,000 and 7,000 feet. It tolerate extreme heat, cold, alkaline soil and drought. In its native state, the wild plum grows on a large bush 5-6 feet tall. The fruit is similar to a cherry in size and has a distinct tart flavor.

Stringer Orchards makes some good plum wine, two liqueurs, regular and plum infused gin as well as plum syrup and two jams. We will be stopping by to taste the wine, liqueurs, and gins along with some complementary cheese and crackers before the short 15 minute drive to the motel.

Dinner will be a Julia's on 397. We ate here on last summer's tour and it is unexpectedly good!

Day two features wide open roads (fast and fun on steroids) to Fields to enjoy their famous ½ burgers and REAL ice cream shakes served with spoons by necessity. The afternoon will again expose most to new roads including Diamond Lane, Lave Bed and Diamond Loop on the way to the Crane General Store for more ice cream or a cold drink. We arrive at the Burns Best Western early enough to enjoy a happy hour. Dinner will be at the Steen Mountain Brewery.

The tour will end in Bend on day 3 after enjoying lunch at Sun River Brewing.






