ABOUT AROO

In the late 1950s, two Giulietta Spider Veloce's came to Portland. They were featured on a local

TV show to promote a sports car race

which they dominated, winning converts in the growing sports car scene. As interest and knowledge of Alfas grew, Alfa fans — known as “Alfisti” — began to gather at Rambo Motors, the new Alfa dealer in Portland, which trained mechanics and supported a racing team. In the early 1960s, Bob Rinde, Rambo's sales manager, joined the national Alfa Romeo Owners Club and others followed. By October 1968 there was enough local interest for Bob McGill to apply to start a chapter, making AROO the sixth AROC-US chapter.

Super Tour – Salmon Run II

Sometimes a great day is worth waiting for!

It hasn't been a great year for AROO Touring. COVID-19, forest fires, political unrest and really bad weather in the fall have curtailed AROO Alfa driving events this year, and nearly every activity has been postponed or canceled.

It almost happened again. Rain and high winds were forecast for October 10th (the scheduled date for the AROO Giulia Super Tour 2020). A change of dates to October 17th, was made hoping for a better weather day. It worked! Saturday October 17th was a perfect fall day.

Santiam Rest Area South Bound

5 Supers and a dozen or so other Alfas plus several drivers of lesser cars received their tour route instructions from Bill and Marian Gillham. The tour was led by the Gillham's in their LeMans Blue Giulia Super "Hooligan". Joining the Hooligan were David and Kathy Beach in their Red Super, photographer Cliff Brunk in his white Super, David and Penny Rossman in their green TI and Bob Hui in his white Super.

Glitches

Before we left we got a call from Brad Baum at the filling

station in Jefferson. His '57 Spider had gone dead. Brad is from Brookings and Larry Marks (from Eugene) drove his newly restored '60 Sprint Special to rescue Brad. It turned out to be a faulty fuse. They met the tour again before we were all across the Willamette on the Buena Vista Ferry. Brad drove the rest of the tour and all the way home to Brookings without further problem. It was the day's only technical problem and the first long drive for the '57 Spider since the '70s.

The second glitch was also obvious before we got to the second instruction. The mileage instructions were listed in kilometers. No problem for the Rally loving AROO bunch; they recalculated and carried on, no sweat.

The Buena Vista Ferry

There has been a ferry across the Willamette River at Buena Vista since 1858. Crossing the river 4 to 6 Alfas at a time on the ferry is always fun, especially during the fall color season, Buena Vista has a wonderful variety of Maples, they were resplendent in full red display.

Hoskins

After everyone had crossed the river and Brad and Larry caught back up, the tour took off in earnest. The route wandered across the rural fields, orchards and vineyards of the Willamette Valley, winding up into the west foot hills and back down into Kings Valley to a rest stop at Fort Hoskins State Park. The park sits in an old orchard at the top of a steep grade. The park looks South East across the Valley, fall colors were at their finest.

The Salmon Run

40 years ago when AROO ran the first Salmon Run to Alsea Falls, the South Fork of the Alsea River was running quite high after a rainy early fall, Coho Salmon were trying to swim up the falls. It was a spectacular sight. Time has not been kind to the Coho runs. We will be lucky to see them this time.

The tour wandered from Fort Hoskins into Philomath and

then turned south toward Bellfountain and Alpine before turning west. Climbing the Coast Range on one of Oregon's best Alfa roads. A hundred hairpins later the tour arrived at Alsea Falls Picnic Area.

Alsea Falls

Lunch was great, socially distanced comradery and tire kicking ensued. Most of us visited the falls, but the Coho were nowhere to be seen, the falls were as beautiful as usual. We shared the park with a bike tour and a cross country race. Many of the participants admired the Alfas.

Decisions

Leaving Alsea Falls the tour followed the Alsea River all the way to the sea in Waldport. Some of the Portland folks left the tour when we arrived in the small town of Alsea, choosing to make the 40 mile run back to I-5 and on to Portland.

Wild Mushrooms

The rest of the tour drove on to the small town of Yachats which is a few miles south of Waldport. Yachats was celebrating its annual Wild Mushroom Festival. All the Restaurants featured wild mushroom dishes on the menu. It was a warm and windless late afternoon as we watched the Pacific surf; a great day for all. Several Alfa participants stayed in town for the night and visited local Restaurants to enjoy seafood and mushrooms. The last survivors of the Salmon Run II drove home in the rain on Sunday.

AROO "Dirty Rat" Rally Results!

Hi All!

8 Cars braved the aptly named Dirty Rat Rally (thanks Simon for "letting" me steal the name...) The rally was a bit more than we normally see in an Alfa Club rally. There were 2 course following traps in the odometer check and 2 controls to see if the ONTO was followed **and** whether you followed your route instructions or just followed the car in front of you at the very start as odd numbered cars went LEFT at the T at Butteville/2nd St and even numbered cars went RIGHT and then both passed each other on Schultz and got back together at the Butteville store going the other direction. That was just the beginning. The scores were really tight in both STD and VINTAGE classes (see below and attached).

Only 1 team (Vintage Class winners Johnson and Menor) caught and properly executed the COMPLETION TRAP on NRI 31 RIGHT @ T (use caution) PAUSE 20 over next .5 mile) and passed up the first road coming to CP#2 in Donald. Teams that "saw" GK Machine and turned right into the control were OFF COURSE. Most teams did well on Leg #3 which did have an off-course loop if you failed to follow the correct route on CASE RD.

Many teams missed CP #4 back at the Butteville cemetery after a short 2 mile loop after CP #3 because they did not COMPLETE NRI 40 as instructed by the CP SLIP (...then LEFT ONTO SCHULTZ CAST 25). That set up a disastrous Leg 5 where every car scattered and the leg was tossed (due to that and a mistake on the CP #4 control slip for the 2 STD Class cars that actually found CP #4).

The team of John Clemson and Doug Zaitz eked out the win over Ed Grayson and Jeff Gretz in STANDARD CLASS (191 vs 241).
