In the late 1950s, two Giulietta Spider Veloce's came to Portland. They were featured on a local

TV show to promote a sports car race

which they dominated, winning converts in the growing sports car scene. As interest and knowledge of Alfas grew, Alfa fans — known as "Alfisti" — began to gather at Rambo Motors, the new Alfa dealer in Portland, which trained mechanics and supported a racing team. In the early 1960s, Bob Rinde, Rambo's sales manager, joined the national Alfa Romeo Owners Club and others followed. By October 1968 there was enough local interest for Bob McGill to apply to start a chapter, making AROO the sixth AROC-US chapter.

In the Driver's Seat



Hondas aren't supposed to do this....

So, have you ever had an oil sump drain plug "back out"?

Why, you may ask ~

I hadn't, in perhaps over 750,000 miles in more than two dozen cars and 45 years of driving, until last week – while driving in a new, "reliable" car, my 2014 Honda CRZ.

What turned out to be an innocent and well-needed "potty stop" was actually a hitting of the proverbial jackpot – I didn't win any money, but I sure saved a sack-full of it!

Following last Sunday's twice-postponed Valentine's Day tour and picnic, I was driving from Portland home to Spokanistan, late on Monday. The usual boring, predictable drive, made dozens of times in the last two and a half decades, seemed no different this time.

While taking the downhill, sweeping left-hand turn into the Hatton-Coulee rest area on Hwy 395 south of Ritzville, I saw a red warning indicator flicker once on my instrument panel. Hmm – I've never seen that one before in my 155k miles of trouble-free ownership ~

I parked the car, turned the engine off and shown my flashlight on the panel, noting that it was the oil pressure light – not good when it's 7 pm, dark, cold and windy, and you're 120 miles from home out in the middle of nowhere.

I opened the hood, donned my mask, and went to see if the newly (Wilsonville dealership) changed oil filter had come loose. There was a slight smell of burning engine oil, but that seems to happen with most "professional" oil changes. No loose filter and no obvious leaks to be found. I stepped back, and looked down at my feet – I was standing in a growing pool of engine oil... In disgust I went to the restroom!

Some four hours later we are unloading it at the Spokane Honda dealership, compliments of AAA, with their unmasked tow truck driver using a non-handsfree cell phone. At least he was driving the truck speed limit for the ninety-mile trip.

I left my keys in the overnight drop box, with a message of "No oil, don't start engine!" The next afternoon I was informed that the oil plug was missing-in-action. I now think the plug had been loose, dripping oil for several hundred miles, and with the parking of the car, it finally just dropped out, onto the parking lot, dumping the remaining quart or two of oil. I took a few photos of the oil slick, and I think I can see a steel plug there. But upon my return four days later, the oil slick was drying out and if there was a plug, it was gone ~

Luckily there was no damage to the engine, as it was not operated without oil, save for the short cavitation during the left turn. The dealership checked things out, replaced filter and oil, cleaned the underside, and sold me a new oil plug for \$14.95! I was back on the road for more adventures the next day.

To be continued with more Honda adventures next month – yes, there's more to my Honda story...






A Journey Back To Greatness 1984 Alfa Romeo GTV6

About a decade ago I became the proud caretaker of a 1977 Alfetta GT. I was not in the market for an Alfa at the time, but when I saw that one for sale I just had to buy it. I purchased it from the original owner and for the whole time I owned it I absolutely loved it. Eventually, I decided to sell it and ever since I have really missed owning that car. That is what brings us to the car I will be talking with you about today.

As I said above I really loved that Alfetta and always wanted to own another one. That being said, while I loved the four cylinder I really wanted to give a GTV6 a try as those were another car I had always wanted. Over the last few years I have casually had my eye out for a suitable candidate, but nothing really caught my eye. A couple months ago that all changed. I was running some errands with my wife and oddly while we were driving around I mentioned to her that I really wanted to get a GTV6 or another GT. Literally ten minutes later as we were coming out of the bakery I saw a GTV6 across the street. Crazy how the world

works. I went across the street to take a look. It had obviously been sitting for quite a while judging by its appearance, but i was able to look past all the faded paint, dust, and cobwebs to see the potential of the car that lay beneath. It took me all of a minute to make up my mind. Through some research I was able to get in contact with the seller and after some brief negotiations it was mine. I had it towed home and started the slow process of making the car great again.

At this point I have just begun the process of getting the car to where I want it to be, but I thought I would share with you all what I bought, where it is at now, and what is to come.

So the car in question is a 1984 GTV6 in Red with Black leather interior. The man that I had purchased the car from had barely owned it a year and had bought it from the original owner. The car has been very well cared for over the years. The odometer

reads just over 30000 miles so I am guessing it is more like 130, but more research is needed to verify that. The body is completely straight except for one tiny ding in the driver's quarter panel. Along with the car I received every receipt, or at least a whole lot of them, for all the work that has been done to the car over the years. Also, all of the original owners manual, epa window tag, Pirelli brochure, the Alfa accessories catalog, and other service manuals etc. that would come with a new car is there. I even have the Alfa Romeo pre delivery inspection, original dealer receipt, and best of all a handwritten thank you note from the dealer. From what I gather the car has been sitting since 05 when the previous owner (also an AROO member, yep -I have his card) purchased a newer car. Below I will list the facts about the car as I know them. Then I will go over what is needed on the car and what its current state is.

- Car was originally purchased from DeFinizio Imports in Essington, Pennsylvania for \$18000 in December of 1983. It was then driven back to Kentucky by the buyer where it lived for several years.
- Around 1988 the owner moved to Georgia.
- In March of 1989 the owner bough a used 2.5
 Milano engine from Paul Spruell Alfa Romeo and
 had the engine swapped into the car. Apparently his
 original motor had low compression. Wait for it, yes
 that's right. I have the original motor as well. It was
 included in the sale.
- Around 2000 the owner moved to Boise where the car now resides.
- The car also has a bunch of performance parts on it. I am not sure when those were acquired. It could have been part of the original purchase, but since I have no concrete dates I shall not list them here. The parts are as follows. Koni shocks, sport springs, updated torsion bars, updated sway bars, and a skid plate under the motor. Along with these parts on the vehicle I have a bunch of nos parts as well. Belts, oil filters, and a bunch of bushings all in original Alfa packaging.
- I have two sets of wheels that came with the car. I have the four that it is currently sitting on. They are

Alfa wheels, but what they came off of I am unsure. I also have the five original wheels that the car came with new. They are 15" Campagnolo wheels in black with a polished lip.

Now that I have covered the details of the car, I will tell you where I am at with the car now. The paint was in pretty poor shape when I got it, but some good polishing has brought it back quite well. It does need some touch up here and there, but overall it is very restorable. Rust is very minimal. Really the only spot is at the bottom of the fender where the sunroof drain is. The interior needs a lot of love. I am guessing sitting parked for 15 years did the seats no favors.

Now to the mechanicals. The car did not run at all when I got it. I replaced the old fuel and was able to get it to cough, but it still needed further looking into. I finally determined that the timing belt had slipped a few teeth on both cams and I had many vacuum leaks. Those are a killer on this bosch injection. I did line the cam belt up correctly and checked compression and it was good across the motor. So now my plan is to replace all vacuum hoses, replace the timing belt and water pump, ignition components and then put it all back together. At that point it should run, at least



hopefully. Then once I know it runs I will move on to the restoration.

Thank you so much for reading. I know this has droned on a bit, but I just wanted to share this amazing find with other enthusiasts like myself. Hopefully I will be able to bring you more updates in the future.







This tour is being planned on behalf of the Alfa Wannabe Car Club but is open to anyone in the Alfa Club that wishes to join us.


