ABOUT AROO

In the late 1950s, two Giulietta Spider Veloce's came to Portland. They were featured on a local TV show to promote a sports car race

which they dominated, winning converts in the growing sports car scene. As interest and knowledge of Alfas grew, Alfa fans — known as "Alfisti" — began to gather at Rambo Motors, the new Alfa dealer in Portland, which trained mechanics and supported a racing team. In the early 1960s, Bob Rinde, Rambo's sales manager, joined the national Alfa Romeo Owners Club and others followed. By October 1968 there was enough local interest for Bob McGill to apply to start a chapter, making AROO the sixth AROC-US chapter.

On the way there, we will enjoy a 90-minute tour through Washington and Yamhill County, including a pit stop at Bald Beak.



Rally Season Kicked Off with AROO Cup #1 on March 12

Here's a quick recap of the March 2023 AROO Cup Rally #1.

We had a good competitive field out today. Thanks to everyone for coming out in spite of the weather. This was a pretty straightforward rally, with no real nasty bits, but certainly required the ability to apply the rules for the course following, particularly navigating through protection "traps," ONTO, and TOWARD. And you really needed a sharp eye (hopefully 4 of them) to watch for signs to keep you on course.

St Paul Regularity

Getting through the first intersection after crossing 219 was the only real challenge here. You should have seen the backward-facing YIELD on the straight route out of the intersection, which forced you right by protection since there was no STOP or YIELD to the right. If you missed it, you saw the "Trucks" sign and got to auto correct, losing only time.

Then there was the Mission Rd chicane with multiple STOPs after the timing control. Same thing, getting those 2 backward facing STOPS in quick succession got you through. The "Observe San Salvatore landing" instruction was a call back in case you got lost in the chicane.

Woodburn Regularity

Started off with "TOWARD WOODBURN." The two Observes for the speed changes did not undo this. There was actually an alert sign for the left turn to Woodburn on Davidson, then a sign at the intersection itself. So if you were working TOWARD correctly you did fine. The observe "Shipping/Receiving" was just a call back in case you missed the turn.

There was another sign for Woodburn that took you right on 219 by direction at the STOP, followed by a quick call back at the 31-mile marker. The straight at

the Y at the SRIP "Woodburn 5" undid the TOWARD. If you highlighted your instructions, you made a very quick right on Mahony, which you followed all the way to River Rd. You turned left ONTO River Rd. This ONTO got you through the T intersection with French Prairie Rd (to the left) and River Rd (to the right) by direction, followed by a quick turn on Keene Rd. Then a left then a right at successive STOPS, with no mileages. But they were the first ones you came to, so no problem. (Now if you had misread or misapplied the left *on* KEENE as an ONTO, you would have turned right at the KEENE/Manning intersection and been all screwed up.) But you made it through the timing control to the break.

Pudding River Regularity

Not much here, just follow the instructions and stay on CAST. One challenge was staying on time with those big pauses, totaling 2 minutes and burning those off (if needed) when you weren't given any more hard time references. But you have all the information needed to calculate a correct time at any of those points, so you should have been OK.

Monitor Regularity

Sharp eyes required on this one. TOWARD Monitor. You needed to see the sign for Monitor at the Y intersection at 0.69 miles, then another one at 3.67 that put you straight on Dominic Rd, go straight by default across Hwy 214 (which has no impact on the TOWARD), then left by direction at the sign for Monitor at the STOP on Meridian Rd. Whew. Then you actually made it to Monitor! (The R at T in downtown undid the TOWARD). The rest was just following instructions and staying on CAST. [Really sharp-eyed folks noticed that instruction #60 ("S on Elliot Prairie Rd") had a spelling error. Google maps shows ELLIOTT (2 Ts). So my bad, but in my defense the sign at the intersection in google street view from 2013 shows ELLIOT, although its ELLIOTT at the other end; I guess that has been fixed. SO lesson to me is be careful with road signs. (You'd think I would have learned that after last year's NWCR debacle at Mount Hope Loop). Thankfully it didn't mess anybody up since there was a hard mileage at the instruction.]



Day 1 has us going up to Windy Ridge at St. Helens to see how the area has changed since the big blast in 1980. Paula and I hiked around St. Spirit Lake the summer of 1979 and we vividly remember the view from Windy Ridge of the old lodge sitting between the mountain and the lake. We visited Windy Ridge as soon as the area reopened and were in blown away by the total destruction. Bring a sack lunch as we will picnic at Windy Ridge.

From there we head into Yakima for our first night's stay. You can make reservations at Comfort Inn and Suites c/o 509-249-1900.

Historic Lodges Tour 2024

July 5-17, 2024

The 2024 Alfa Wannabe Tour will take us to three National Parks and feature 6 old lodges and one very old hotel, all on the National Register of Historic Places. The tour will be 13 days in length.

The first night will feature Timberline Lodge (1937). After an early afternoon walk among the wildflowers and a soak in the outdoor hot tub, we enjoy libations in the Ram's Head bar and enjoy fellowship and dinner in the lodge.

Day 2 has us heading to Lake Quinault Lodge (1926) in the Olympic National Park. The lodge sits on the lake among huge fir trees. One will be able to choose among several short hikes in dense rain forest, see the world's largest Sitka tree and/or sit on the grounds behind the lodge and relax.

We next head to Lake Crescent Lodge (1915) also in the Olympic National Forest. A short walk in the Hoh Rain Forest is a must since we are in the area. Thereafter, we visit Ruby Beach, which I feel is one of the more scenic beaches in the NW. Finally, we stop at the Makah Tribal Museum located on the NW tip of Washington. While not being a large facility, the museum has outstanding exhibits.

Days 4 and 5 are at Paradise Inn (1916) on Mt. Rainier. Along the way, we will drive up to Hurricane Ridge to bid farewell to the Olympic Mountains. If the snowpack cooperates, the wildflowers should be beautiful. Once in Rainier, we will take the scenic drive to Sunrise Point, one of the higher places one can drive to and have sufficient time to enjoy this beautiful setting.

The next destination is the Balch Hotel (1907) in the small town of Dufur. The hotel was built by Charles Balch, a rancher who relocated here form Massachusetts in the early 1900's. This hotel has been restored with loving care to retain much of its original glory.

Day 8 has us heading East to enjoy some open roads and the historic Wallowa Lake Lodge (1923). Along the way, we will enjoy the fabulous drive from

8 spots left!

NW tip of Lewiston, ID to Enterprise on Hwy 3 with a stop at St.

Joseph Overlook for a grand view.

The next historic lodge is too far away to reach in a day. Hence, we will spend a night in Bend at the fun and funky St. Charles School McMenamins.

Thereafter, we are off to Crater Lake Lodge (1915) for two nights. In addition to making the Rim Drive, we will take a cruise around the lake and spend some time on Wizard Island.

Day 11 has us at what will be a newly refurbished Chateau at the Oregon Caves (1931). We will arrive early enough to take the cave tour, which is a must if you have not done it before.

The following day we drive through the California Redwoods, stopping for a short hike among the biggest of the Redwoods in the Jedediah Smith Forest.

Our final destination is Yachats on the Oregon Coast. The plan is to stay at the Overleaf Motel, a very nice place directly on the beach. I hope to get us into ONO for dinner, which features excellent seafood.

The tour will be limited to 20 couples (only 8 left!), but I will maintain an alternate list as there are usually one or two cancellations. If you have interest in joining this tour, please let me know. Once it is possible to make reservations (I anticipate this will be in April or May) I will require a deposit *up to* \$3400 (depending on how much the advance deposits are) which represents the estimated first nights lodging at each location. My experience with the upcoming 2023 National Park Tour was the lodges required the first night's lodging be paid at time of booking.







1. Minutes (Sue Halton)

A. Doug Zaitz moved to approve the Minutes as edited for housekeeping corrections.

March Special Meeting Board Minutes

1. Call to Order

President Chris Bright called the meeting to order at 5:07 p.m. and declared that there was a quorum.

Bright called the Special Meeting in accordance with Article 5, Section 5 of the AROO bylaws. It was called with at least two days' written notice per Article 5, Section 6.

In the absence of Secretary Halton, Bright stated that he is recording the meeting and offered to prepare the minutes, which will be approved by the board.

2. Operation of the Meeting

Treasurer Banzer and Zaitz, prior to the meeting, had asserted that the meeting was to be run by Robert's Rules of Order, specifically pointing out that the Chair could not offer motions. Bright, in response, said that that was not true, but the meeting would be run in an orderly manner.

3. Purpose of the Meeting

Bright called this meeting to discuss the future of the Northwest Classic Challenge (NWCC). There will be a vote to agree on how to proceed with the NWCC.

4. Events of the Past Week

Bright recapped the sequence of events in order to level-set all board members about what took place around the return of Dennis Howell to procure sponsorship for NWCC, the dismissal of Chris Finks as

Sponsorship Chair, the meeting that took place at the Banzer residence, the resignation of Leslie Jackson as NWCC Chair, and subsequent interactions prior to the Special Meeting, including written protests about postponing the meeting until all members could be present.

5. Current Financial Situation for NWCC

Vice President Davis reported that the current commitment to the host hotel Valley River Inn is \$2,250. Banzer further noted that expenditures to date have been \$1,323.73.

Banzer reported entry fees to date are \$19,600 (compared to \$25,600 for 2022 total) and \$10,500 in sponsorships to date.

6. Discussion

- Banzer was not supportive after 2022 performance but was encouraged by Vintage Underground's commitment. Registration and sponsorship were low in 2022. This year is looking better. More interest is being shown this year from participants. Sports Car Market has offered an e-blast to support the NWCC.
- Davis inquired about returns from 2022 and who is new. Eklund said that the majority appear to be returning participants.
- Eklund stated we have 26 registrations at this time.
 Expects more entrants this month. Believe we have a good base and momentum is building. Does not see a reason at this time to cancel an event that can be successful.
- Davis said that break-even for 2023 was built around 55 paid registrations and \$20,000 in sponsorship. This was paired with a stripped-down budget. The success of NWCC is dependent on new sign-ups and we have a gap.
- Davis said that the deadline for the next step in a commitment to the Valley River Inn is early May. He also added that he is confident that the hotel will be ready.
- Banzer added that Vintage Underground and Avants are promoting the event.

- Dolphin noted we are still in a window until the next commitment increase is due to VRI. This could provide an opportunity for the committee to make progress.
- laboni pointed out that we are down by two chairs and asked who remains to fill those positions.
 Concerned about not having enough people.
- Dale supports it but is concerned about the lack of a team. Strongly wants to do it, but thinks we have to be realistic.
- Bright said that we need to be responsible for the club's funds and the volunteer crew is thin. Rallying is a shrinking event as the "old guard" ages out. Bright also commented that the dismissal of Chris Finks was very poorly handled and decisions were being made without board consultation.
- Davis asked what percentage of AROO members are benefitting from this. Only 12-13 AROO members took part, only about 5% of our membership.

7. Vote on 2023 of NWCC

Dolphin moved that the NWCC Committee have until May 1st to achieve at least 50 paid registrations and \$15,000 in sponsorship in order for the event to move forward. This will allow us to avoid an increase in hotel charges. This proposal has firm targets and timelines and does not increase our financial risk.

Davis noted that we will be driving registrations and have a potential for increasing disappointment should we cancel. Davis also noted there is an open issue around dinners for Friday and Saturday nights. He will contact the hotel for clarification.

Eklund seconded the motion put forth by Dolphin.

The motion passed with a vote of 7-2.

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
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
